



Are there any government subsidies for Danish energy storage projects





Overview

The CCUS Fund is a market-based, technology-neutral fund aimed at supporting carbon capture, storage and utilization. The government earmarked DKK 16 billion in subsidies to CCUS projects, to be distributed in two phases. Therefore, a political decision has been made to establish three subsidy funds to support the deployment of CCS technology in Denmark and to deliver greenhouse gas reductions by 2030 and 2050 to contribute to the achievement of Danish and international climate goals. These subsidy funds are. The Danish government has recently allocated 1 billion DKK in 2024 for state support of the development of the green industry. The CCS Fund will allocate DKK 1. With Danish households paying €0. 45/kWh for electricity (30% above EU average), smart homeowners are combining solar panels and batteries to slash bills. The project will capture and store 430,000 tonnes of CO₂ annually from 2026.

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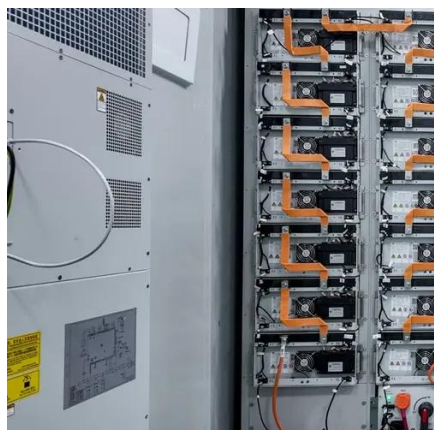
