Telco 4iG's One Hungary brand launched this month, combining Digi Hungary and Vodafone Hungary into a single, state-backed telco, after a government-subsidized shopping spree aimed at challenging Deutsche Telekom's local subsidiary, Magyar Telekom. The first telegraph station on Hungarian territory was opened in December 1847 in Pressburg/ Pozsony / Bratislava /. In 1848, during the Hungarian Revolution, another telegraph centre was built. There are four MNOs in the Hungarian market, Magyar Telekom (59. 3% owned by Deutsche Telekom), Yettel (owned by PPF Group and rebranded from Telenor), Vodafone (acquired by 4iG and the Hungarian state), and DIGI (which is also owned by 4iG and is Hungary's newest market entrant with the smallest. T-Systems Hungary is a prominent player in the B2B ICT sector, providing a wide array of solutions including networks and IT security, which are essential components in telecommunications. The company emphasizes innovation and collaborates with clients to tackle complex challenges, making it a key.
